A feature that differentiates Personality Psychology from other efforts (in Philosophy, Religion, Literature, etc.) to understand human nature is that the personality psychologist attempts to develop theories that are grounded in established scientific knowledge and that can be tested empirically, in other words, that can be tested through scientific observation and experimentation.
